The aim of the basic and basic skills builder (or BKSb) tests is to assess a candidate's competence in English, maths and information and communication technology (ICT) before they start to carry out functional skills tests. The Department for Education and Skills has identified the various basic skills that people need to navigate life and succeed in what they have called functional skills. BKSb is one type of test available to assess a person's functional skills level and identify the areas that need to be improved to bring them to the required level. BKSb tests are given to people who did not achieve higher-grade GCSEs but intend to access college courses or apprenticeships. If the person applying for an apprenticeship has not achieved an A* to C (or equivalent) in GCSE English and Maths, they may work in their BKSb level 2. Some employers use BKSb tests to assess entry-level jobs. It is recognised that this skill group is essential for success in all areas and in everyday life. BKSb tests are also commonly used during the rehabilitation of offenders to prepare them for life and work after being in prison. The BKSb consists of two main areas: initial assessment/Diagnostic evaluation.
